UNIT 5: TRUSTWORTHY

ANCHOR: Being **trustworthy** is being honest and reliable and doing what you say.

ACTION POINT #1: Being **trustworthy** means you are honest to people around you.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. What strange thing happened on deck when the crew picked up Professor Monacle?
2. What is the name of the Professor's friend?
3. What did Kiwi say to Diggy, and what did Diggy tell the others?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Do a trust walk around you house. Everyone gets a turn being blindfolded, and they must be led around by the rest of the family. Talk about why it was hard not to be able to see and if it was difficulty to trust others to lead.



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ANCHOR: Being **trustworthy** is being honest and reliable and doing what you say.

ACTION POINT #3: Being **trustworthy** means people can trust you.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. What did Diggy and Piper do to prepare for the pirate attack?
2. Why were they hiding outside the Captain's window?
3. Why were they surprised when they heard the Professor and Captain talking?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Family Promises. Have everyone in the family make a promise to someone else. Write the promises down on a list and refer to them during the week to make sure everyone is being trustworthy and doing what they said they would do.



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ANCHOR: Being **trustworthy** is being honest and reliable and doing what you say.

ACTION POINT #2: Being **trustworthy** means you are loyal to those who confide in you.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. What did Kiwi tell Diggy?
2. How did Diggy trust Piper?
3. Why did Piper want Diggy to go to the Captain and tell him about the pirates?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Have everyone in the family share something that the others might not know about them. Make sure everyone understands that when you share things in the family that it is a place where everyone can trust one another.



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ANCHOR: Being **trustworthy** is being honest and reliable and doing what you say.

ACTION POINT #4: Being **trustworthy** means you keep your promise.

CONVERSATION STARTERS:

1. Why did Piper and Diggy want to talk to the Captain?
2. What happened when the Captain came to the deck?
3. What did Diggy and Piper find out about the pirate attacks?

FAMILY ACTIVITY:

Have a Trust Taste Test! Select some fun foods for others to taste with their eyes closed, or use a blindfold to make it extra fun. Make a promise to the family that you will only have each other taste things that you know each other likes, and make sure to keep that promise!
